

GREEN VALLEY RIFLE & PISTOL CLUB FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Steel Targets – Can I bring my own steel targets to shoot at the range? Personal steel targets are prohibited at Green Valley ranges.

Green Tip Ammo – Can I shoot green tip 5.56mm ammo? Green tip ammo can be used on cardboard and paper targets only. It is not true armor piercing ammo, but it will damage steel targets.

Clay Birds – Can I shoot clay birds on the ranges? Clay birds can be used for rifle and pistol targets only if they are placed at a height no greater than 5 feet close to the impact berm. Remnants of the clay birds must be collected and placed in the trash for disposal. Launched clay bird shooting is **prohibited** on all ranges and areas. Shotgun hulls must be collected and placed in the trash.

Used Cardboard Targets – Used NRA AP-1 (Tombstone) targets, sticks and clips are available in the Red Shed (next to range #1) for membership use. The targets are taped together in groups of 4 from previous competitions. Please use just one target at a time and not all 4.

Family Memberships – What does “Family Membership” mean? Life and Annual memberships are considered family memberships. Only one membership is required for any a family. A “family” shall mean the member, the member’s spouse, and the member’s children and stepchildren who are under 18 years of age. The Club member must be with the family members at all times.

Club Member Guest Limitations – How many guest can a member bring? Club members are allowed to bring a limited number of unrelated guest to the range. The member is totally responsible for their guest and should limit the number to 1 or 2. Guest Rule of Thumb: If you bring the same person to the range 3 times in a year, they should join the club.

Large Groups – If I’m a member, can I bring a large group of non-members to the range to shoot? The short answer is **No**. Arrangements for work or church groups can be made if properly supervised for a fee and signed liability waivers from all non-members. Contact the Range Scheduler for more information and to schedule the event.

Scheduling a Range – As a member, can I reserve a specific range on a day and time? **No**. Ranges are only scheduled for firearms instruction by law enforcement agencies, training instructors, and discipline events held weekly and monthly. Range availability is on a first come basis. If you want to use a specific range, first check the schedule at www.gvshoot.com.

Target Placement – What is the safest place to have my target stand? Targets on “H” frame holders should be as close to the impact berm as possible. That way you know all rounds are going into the berm and the likelihood of a ricochet is minimum.

Membership Expiration – When does my membership expire each year? Memberships expire on December 31st. Renewals are sent out by December 1st to all current members. Renewal information is available at www.gvshoot.com if you can't find your renewal. You must possess a current range pass to utilize the facilities.

Lost Range Pass – I lost my range pass, what should I do? Email the Treasurer and request a new range pass. Allow 5 to 10 days for the replacement to arrive.

Gate Access – Should I open the gate for someone that says they are a member, but does not have a current range pass? **NO**. Only members with a current range pass are allowed on the property. We have had people trying to gain access to the facilities stating the SWAT team said they could pickup brass or some other wild story. Do not let them in.

Action Pistol Competition – I'm interested in doing Action Pistol and shooting in a Regional match. What is the best way to get started? Come to Green Valley's monthly matches which are open to the public and very low key. The staff are always welcoming to new shooters and will help you through the event.

Staff Availability – Green Valley staff are always at the range on Monday mornings if you have some questions.

Forced Reset Triggers (FRT) & Full Automatic Fire - Are FRT and full automatic fire Prohibited at the facilities? Short answer: Only on some ranges. FRT and Full automatic fire is **Prohibited** on Hallsville range #1 Lower Mover, range #2 Falling Plates, range #3 Barricade, and range #4 Practical. Full Automatic Fire and FRT are prohibited on all Columbia ranges.

Discipline Events – IDPA, USPSA, Action Pistol, COMO Tuesday Night Thunder, Steel Challenge and .22LR Silhouette events are open to the public and members. Non-members must leave the property once the event is concluded and are not authorized to use other ranges except those designated for the event.
